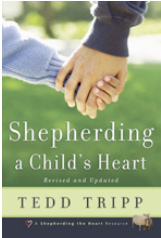

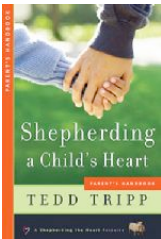

#### **Shepherding a Child's Heart (Tedd Tripp)**

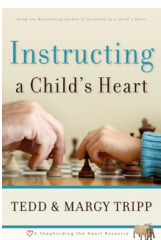

Tedd Tripp has given us a valuable tool as a companion to Shepherding a Child's Heart. The Handbook deepens the shepherding model found in the book.

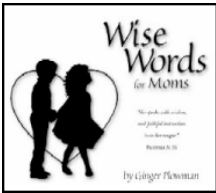

#### **Instructing a Child's Heart (Tedd & Margy Tripp)**

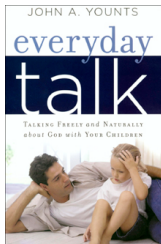

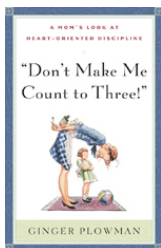
## Wise Words for Moms (Ginger Plowman)

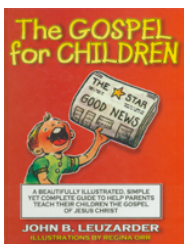
## Everyday Talk (John Younts)
